

Joe and Terri Guenther Graduate Scholarship

History of Endowment: Joe and Terri Guenther were raised on neighboring potato farms in Wisconsin. Joe earned a BS at the University of Wisconsin, an MS from Montana State University and his PhD from Washington State University. In 1980, Joe accepted a position as Extension Economist with the University of Idaho. Joe and Terri moved to Moscow in 1983 where Joe continued as a faculty member in the College of Agricultural and Life Sciences (CALs). Joe specialized in the economics of the potato industry during his 33+ years as a Professor of Agricultural Economics and continues to remain active as Professor Emeritus along with operating Guenther Consulting. This endowment was created to honor the Career of Joe Guenther and his affiliation with the University of Idaho. The Guenther's have had a strong loyalty to UI CALs and they are proud to provide this scholarship to deserving students who want to have a career in the potato industry.

Eligibility: Open to full-time graduate students enrolled in the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences who wish to pursue a career in the potato industry. Selection based primarily on merit. Minimum 3.0 GPA. First consideration given to students whose family have been involved in potato farming or have potato industry connection. Second consideration given to students interested in potato-related graduate research. Financial need shall not be a consideration.

Criteria Summary: Submit a brief summary of your involvement in 1) potato farming and/or 2) connection to the potato industry and/or 3) potato-related graduate research.
