- · And More!


The training is scheduled for Tuesdays and Thursdays from end of January through mid-April. Each class will run from 9:00am—noon

Volunteer Commitment

After completing 30 hours of educational training, an additional minimum of 30 hours of practicum/hands-on training and directed volunteer service must be completed to become a certified volunteer. The type of hands-on training is based on a mutual decision between the supervising UI Extension educator and the Idaho Master Gardener trainee. Part of the volunteer hours are spent in the Extension office plant clinics assisting homeowners with their gardening questions. The other volunteer hours can be spent on a variety of educational gardening projects.
