How will the course be delivered?	Classes are taught on-campus during the times listed in the Class Schedule.  If feasible for course content, a concurrent virtual section can be offered with corresponding section(s). This is not required. CETL can help Merge Sections within Canvas.	Classes taught via Zoom (or similar technology) during the times listed in the Class Schedule.  Can be offered concurrently with an inperson class. To connect a virtual section with an in-person class, the instructor should work with their departmental scheduler via CLSS. CETL can help Merge Sections within Canvas.  A limited number of classes are offered as stand-alone virtual courses	Classes taught asynchronously online using Canvas. These courses do <b>not</b> have a regularly scheduled meeting time.

- Courses should be delivered in the format designated on the class schedule.
- Departments can add a concurrent virtual section to a class if desired via their departmental scheduler via CLSS.
- Students cannot switch attendance between in-person and virtual sections.
- Virtual and Online (web) courses carry a web fee of \$35/credit. Fees cannot be waived.
