Notes & Requirements - North Idaho College

- Students planning on transferring to UI are advised to complete an Associate's.
- Students can concurrently be enrolled while completing an NIC degree.
- A background check, 2.75 GPA and min of C in ENGL 102, COMM 101, EDCU 201 and a core MATH are required for admission into UI.

Notes & Requirements - University of Idaho

- 120 credits are required for a B.S.
- A grade of C or above is required for courses in the program.
- Students must pass Elementary Ed: Content Knowledge, Idaho Comprehensive Literacy Assessment 1 & 2, and Praxis exams prior to their internship.
